Executive Summary

District Strategic Plan 2025

Orange County Public Schools is the ninth-largest school district in the United States and the fourth largest in Florida. The district serves more than 206,000 students at 202 schools and is one of the largest employers in Central Florida with more than 25,000 team members.

Vision: To ensure every student has a promising and successful future.

Mission: With the support of families and the community, we create enriching and diverse pathways to lead our students to success.

School Collection Development Plan

Piedmont Lakes Middle School serves 966 students enrolled in grades sixth through eighth. The student population's ethnicity is made up of 49% Hispanic and 51% Non-Hispanic students. Additionally, we serve a diverse population made up of 63% White, 31% Black, 0% Native, 1% Asian, 1% Pacific, and 3% Multicultural students.

The administration includes Principal Frederick Ray Jr. and Assistant Principals Shalonda Jenkins and James Montgomery. Piedmont Lakes Middle School is proud to offer the many special programs which provide students with opportunities. These include Cambridge Academy, Agricultural Science, STEM, Digital Arts, Art, Spanish, and computer classes. We also have soccer, chess club, FFA, Beta club, National Junior Honor Society, SGA, GSA, and enrichment opportunities for our students.

A thorough analysis of the current media center collection at Piedmont Lakes Middle School indicates that the average age of the collection is 2009 and the number of books per student is 11. The <u>American Association for School Libraries</u> has established a criteria for a highly effective media center that includes a ratio of 15-20 books available per student in the collection. At this time, Piedmont Lakes Middle School does not meet the recommended standards for the number of books per student.

The analysis of the collection also revealed the following areas of strengths and concerns:

- Weeding will focus on the OCPS Catalog Project expectations as well as aged titles in fiction and/or nonfiction.
- The average age of the collection is 2009, which is acceptable, but can be further improved.
- This collection contains many of the titles suggested by the DOE list and the new B.E.S.T. Standards suggested readings.
- With 30% of our school population being ELL students, there is a need for more books in Spanish and with Hispanic heritage for our collection.
- This collection is in need of more popular fiction, graphic novels and non-fiction books

like art, technology, and STEM that interest students.

Representation Analysis

To deepen focus on strategic collection development, specific sections of the collection were analyzed in detail to determine whether the media center collection reflects and represents various points of view and experiences. The goal is to provide a balanced collection that can be both a mirror, to reflect a reader's experience, and a window, so readers can experience different viewpoints.

Results

Based on the available school data of Piedmont Lakes Middle School in comparison to Collection Analysis results, it was found that:

Summary

After completing a deeper, targeted analysis of the representation section of the TitleWise report, it was determined that:

- Hispanic students are 49% of the school's population. However, we only have 312 titles tagged as LatinX and only 15% of the characters or biographies feature Hispanic people.
- Many of our students read in their native language as well as emerging second language readers. This is a need in our collection.
